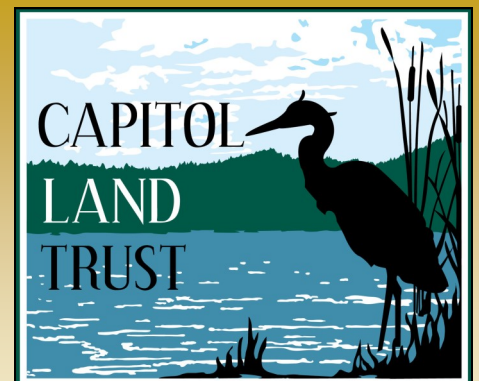

Letter from the Board President

I'm a numbers guy. I initially got involved with the land trust by joining the Finance Committee then becoming a Board Member and Treasurer. Of course, having grown up in Olympia and choosing to be a Park Ranger as my first career, I have a deep love for the outdoor places and open spaces that surround us, and Capitol Land Trust's mission to protect them.

When I joined the Board in 2010, we were just beginning to implement a five-year plan to significantly advance Capitol Land Trust's conservation work. We had newly committed to conserving working farms and forests in addition to marine shorelines, rivers, wetlands and prairies; and were taking a broader view of our conservation potential in southwest Washington.

We met the goals of that plan in spades and became a stronger organization. Now, as President, I am excited to launch our next five-year plan with new, ambitious goals and to see how it carries us into the future. Two goals I'm excited about: First, we aim to protect 14 new conservation properties, prioritizing the most important habitats in our region. Second, we are committing to making a few of our preserves open to the public and working with schools to provide 400 students per year with meaningful environmental education experiences.

Overall, we project that it will take \$19 million to achieve all the goals we've laid out for the next five years. Between government and foundation grants,

businesses, and many individual supporters, I know we can get there.

supporters have grown during my time on the Board. Looking out over 550 supporters filling the entire gym at the Annual Conservation Breakfast is a testament to this growth—double from when I started.

*Furthering collaborative and strategic conservation

What We Can Achieve by 2020

When you hear the words 'strategic plan', do your eyes glaze over as you visualize a mundane report on a shelf collecting dust? Or do you see the potential of what you can achieve with a clear path to guide you? We see the latter.

In 2015 we developed a plan for the next five years to catalyze our conservation outcomes. Our kick-off was a Board retreat where we dug deep to define Capitol Land Trust's niche. It was clear—it's our collaborative approach to conservation and finding solutions that promote economic well-being and diverse community interests, as well as rigorous environmental standards.

Then, through roundtable workshops with 60 partners and community organizations, many one-on-one conversations and outreach with supporters and members, we examined what we can do better. Again, a few clear concepts bubbled to the top:

DEVELOP A MULTI-GENERATIONAL CONSERVATION VISION FOR SOUTHWEST WASHINGTON

Our clear vision is of a region where people, animals, and natural habitats thrive because the community invests in conservation of our natural places and natural resources. But what does that look like on the ground in 10, 50, or 100 years? Working with partners, we

will create a guiding framework—our road map—for protecting our natural resources in concert with economic and social development goals for our region, as we evaluate specific property acquisitions and initiatives.

***What we will do:** Establish a collaborative vision · Conserve 14 new properties · Continue to restore habitats on conserved lands*

ENGAGE PEOPLE ON OUR LANDS AND BUILD THE NEXT GENERATION OF CONSERVATION LEADERS

Much like other land trusts across the country, most of our history has been about protecting lands and setting them aside from people—even the very people who donated time and money and whose taxes helped ensure their protection. Yet many of our preserves can support passive recreation while still protecting habitat and species. So, we are prioritizing five preserves to open to the public with recreational and educational trails. We are working with teachers to use our preserves as living classrooms, where students can take science, math, and social studies lessons outside in a natural setting close to home.

***What we will do:** Enhance 5 properties with trails /amenities · Implement Shelton FieldSTEM Initiative · Host 400 students per year on our preserves*



ADVANCE ORGANIZATIONAL SUSTAINABILITY TO MEET OUR GOALS

As a land trust, our promise is to protect the lands in our care—forever. So we always must look to the future and adapt to changing funding, politics, and our evolving goals. Now, more than ever, we must diversify our funding sources, have adequate reserves to manage our lands and bridge tough times, and maintain the highest standards of practices and organizational leadership.

We couldn't be more excited about the future and what is possible. Of course, it's only possible because of your support and long-term commitment to protecting our truly special natural areas and working lands.

2015 Conserved Lands have Regional Benefits

ROSE ACQUISITION BUILDS ON GOLDSBOROUGH CREEK REVITALIZATION

The 20-acre Rose II acquisition completes phase two of our North Fork Goldsborough Creek acquisition effort, which conserved 165 acres of forested wetlands, riparian floodplain, and pockets of old-growth forest, along with a mile of the creek and 1,600 feet of its tributaries.

The 1920s damming of Goldsborough Creek blocked fish passage to the vast majority of its watershed. Since dam removal in 2001, this creek has become one of the highest priority streams in the Oakland Bay watershed, due in part to its high quality salmon habitat. The Goldsborough Creek coho run is the only South Sound coho run with an increasing population, pointing to the success of conservation partners.

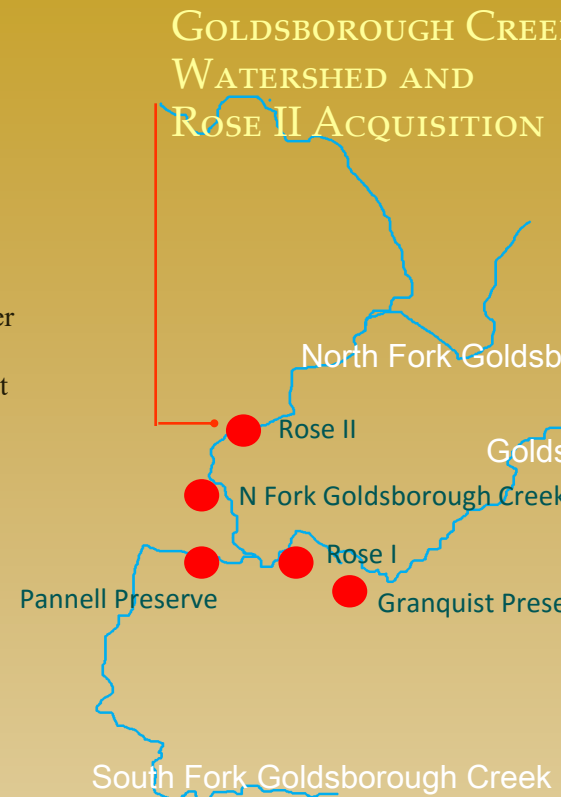
Capitol Land Trust, the Squaxin Island Tribe, and the Puget Sound Salmon Recovery Lead Entity Working Group prioritized protection and restoration of Goldsborough Creek for re-establishing salmon in Puget Sound. To date, CLT has conserved more than 300 acres in the watershed to form a core salmonid habitat area.

BAYSHORE PRESERVE RESTORATION IMPROVES OAKLAND BAY SYSTEM

You may be aware that in 2014 we purchased our Bayshore Preserve, conserving a 74-acre peninsula jutting into Oakland Bay with 4,000 feet of marine shoreline and 2,000 feet of lower Johns Creek. But did you know we did amazing restoration work there this past summer?

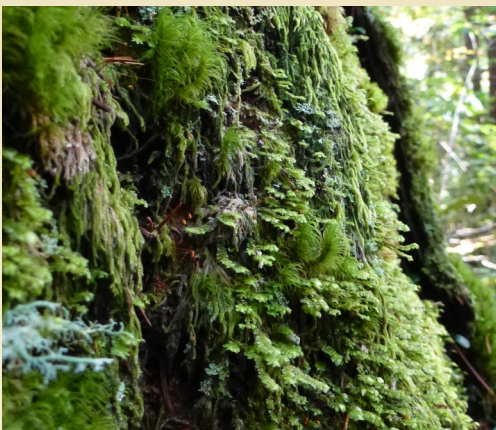
Restoration focused on improving salmon habitat, on both creek and marine shoreline. On Johns Creek, we removed two bridges and riprap in several places; excavated multiple side-channels and habitat pockets; and installed 100 logs and root wads in the creek and along the banks to combat erosion.

On the marine shoreline we removed a 1,400-foot long dike and excavated seven channels to mimic branching channels that occur naturally in salt marshes and estuaries, allowing saltwater to regularly inundate areas to return them back to native salt marsh. The overall goal is to increase complex habitat for salmon, especially juveniles, to offer more places to hide and feed as they transition to the saltwater environment.



Next we will revegetate upland areas. By preventing further development on this former golf course, we help prevent storm water, lawn chemicals, septic discharge and other pollutants from entering the water—for a healthier and more productive Oakland Bay!

PROTECTING GOLDSBOROUGH CREEK AND OAKLAND BAY MEANS PROTECTING PUGET SOUND

Puget Sound Chinook and steelhead salmon are listed as endangered. Restoring the health of Puget Sound not only is critical for these species' survival, but also the health and way of life for people from Everett to Allyn. The Governor's State of Salmon report states, "habitat protection actions must be significantly strengthened while continuing to restore habitat." Our efforts in the southern reaches of the Sound do just that and have an important role in protecting all of Puget Sound.

HIGHLIGHTING KARIN STRELIOFF, 'UBER MEMBER'

It's July, and on what was once Hole 6 of the Bayshore Golf Course bulldozers are digging new tidal channels at Bayshore Preserve. Thirty logs with gnarly root wads loaded on a truck are carefully guided to Johns Creek. And there, on site, is one critical team member behind the grand design... Karin Strelloff.

Karin, a land trust member since 2005, was on the Board of Directors from 2008-2010. She's an 'Uber Member'—one of those amazing people who dedicates time, talents, effort and money to help us carry out the mission. And there's no doubt, 2015 was a showcase year for Karin.

In her own words, "I've always believed conservation is the most elegant way to leave a legacy for future generations—human and otherwise. CLT staff and supporters embrace this idea. They work very hard and collaboratively to realize a vision that spans generations—and that honors the natural world which ultimately supports us all."

Capitol Land Trust hired Mason Conservation District, where Karin is an Environmental Specialist, to oversee restoration at Bayshore. As Project Manager, Karin worked with engineer Rich Geiger and others to design the new marine shoreline and freshwater habitat and to help oversee construction. A landscape architect, Karin was perfect for collaboratively designing a project to improve ecological function, protect cultural values, and lend itself to public enjoyment into the future.

Karin also is dedicated to inspiring the next generation of conservation leaders, especially young women, to pursue careers in natural resources, environmental design, and conservation. This summer, Karin volunteered to lead a group of girls as part of the *Girls Without Limits!* YWCA Camp at Bayshore Preserve. Karin planned a *Day in the Life of a Landscape Architect* and taught them how to develop a public access and trail plan for Bayshore, which they all did in small teams.

She believes: "Girls who encounter professional women engaged in science and design, and who see that their ideas are heard and respected, will grow up to lead those professions in new directions."

Then, she and fellow CLT supporters Bob Barnes and Robert Shinbo volunteered to design an interpretive trail system there. Bayshore has always been an important part of Shelton's community and the Squaxin Island Tribe's history. Karin wants to make sure it stays available

to the public, while protecting its precious marine, freshwater and prairie systems.

"There is no substitute for that feeling you get when you stand, immersed, in a beautiful place that simply surges with life. CLT protects exactly these types of places—wetlands and marine shorelines, prairies and river floodplains, working forests and farms—places that are full of life and that make our world so compelling and beautiful. We all need to experience this magic directly to also recognize how fragile and precious such places are. Facilitating public access will connect more of our community members to these special places so that they too can join the effort to protect and steward our natural world."

We couldn't have said it better. Karin walks the walk. We are so grateful for her leadership in our community.



Why I support CLT

As a former board member and long-time member I have a commitment to support Capitol Land Trust. As a person active in conservation work, CLT is a way to act locally. 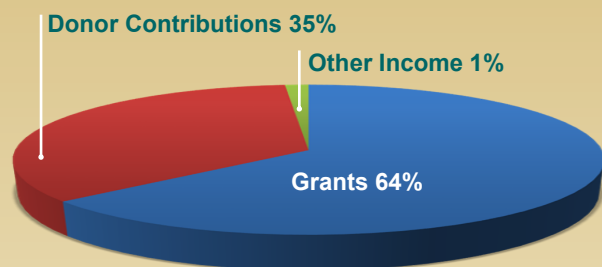

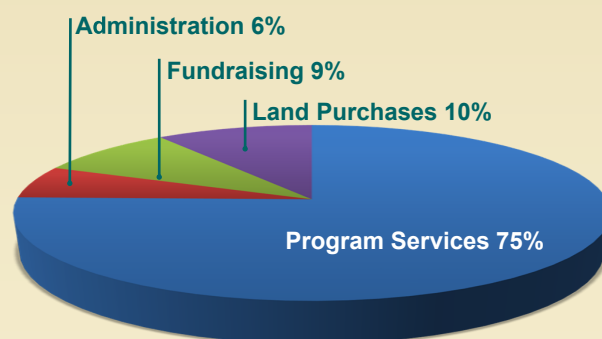

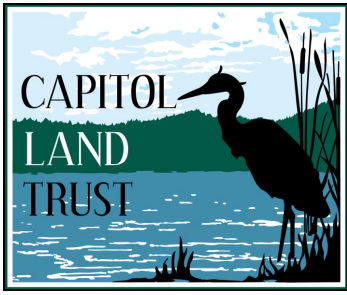
